OCLC FirstSearch

OCLC has added 145 new journals from 17 publishers to the OCLC FirstSearch Electronic Collections Online service. There are now 2,106 journals available online. Libraries that offer Electronic Collections Online allow users to search for citations by browsing lists of journals, selected issues or selected topic areas, as well as providing abstracts and the full text of articles. Two notable publishers now making their journals available are the Oxford University Press and Hayworth Press. New FirstSearch Update

Four databases, MLA Bibliography, SocioAbs, Sociological Abstracts and OCLC Union Lists of Periodicals, and French and Spanish versions of online help were added to the New FirstSearch service in mid-December. There are now 85 databases available, with the final database, Basic BIOSIS, to be added soon. For a complete list of databases see www.oclc.org/oclc/fs/9085fs/tablerev.htm. Since OCLC is making the current FirstSearch available in tandem with New FirstSearch through at least June 2000, current FirstSearch users have plenty of time to familiarize themselves with and try out the new service. OCLC mailed New FirstSearch marketing packets to libraries subscribed to FirstSearch. The packets provide several ways to introduce the new service to patrons. Included are a press release to send to the local media, a news article for the library newsletter and a poster.

SilverPlatter Full Text Update

SilverPlatter has added two new databases, Annual Reports and Portland Press, to the 85 SilverLinker databases already available. These scientific-based publishers issue literature reviews summarizing important developments in the fields of biomedical science and engineering as well as the physical and social sciences. Portland Press has gone one step further by making all articles from issues prior to January 2000 available to all users free of charge. This means that back articles on the Portland Press database are available from SilverPlatter through SilverLinker for anybody, whether or not they have a print subscription. SilverPlatter is now the sole vendor to offer the Directory of Periodicals electronically. SilverPlatter will include the Directory with the MLA Bibliography database beginning February 2000. The directory supplies research submission and subscription information for more than 3,500 journals and series.

SilverPlatter discontinued two Gale Group databases, Research Centers and Services Directory and the Directory of Databases, on January 1. Orders will no longer be accepted.

CIS History Universe

Final pricing for History Universe Access to African-American Studies has been set at \$0.385 per FTE student for the calendar year 2000. This useful database provides libraries and schools with an extensive collection of information resources on African American history, including legislation, U.S. Supreme Court

decisions, reference works, biographies and articles from selected academic journals. New subscribers will still be granted the promised two-for-one deal and have their subscriptions automatically extended to end on January 1, 2002.
